Who are Manhigimot?

Our 11th and 12th grade *eidah* (cohort) is called "Manhigimot", which means "Leaders."

What essential questions do Manhigimot explore?

Manhigimot explore the questions, How have I grown as a Jew and emerging adult? What else do I want to learn? Where do I go from here?

What are the enduring understandings of the Manhigimot experience?

- I can lean on Jewish tradition as I hone my leadership skills.
- I am responsible for my own Jewish identity.

What do Manhigimot learn?

Manhigimot study Jewish life (home and community) and other subjects.

How do Manhigimot learn?

The Manhigimot schedule includes a few gatherings on Friday and Saturday evenings over the course of the year.

What else is important to know about the Manhigimot experience?

The Manhigimot experience is a two-year program; both grades learn together in a given year, but the curriculum rotates on a two-year cycle between grades.

More will be shaped and shared about the year as Manhigimot gather to determine their interests and the direction of the experience.
